

he City of Hartford is committed to creating a livable and sustainable capital city and has experienced tremendous progress in the last ten years. Over the last three years and under the direction of Mayor Pedro Segarra, the City has adopted and actively pursued 5 major housing objectives — reconstructing or renovating all of its antiquated public housing; residential development in the City's downtown; implementing a city-wide Anti-Blight initiative; targeted neighborhood stabilization; and increased mixed-income homeownership opportunities.
