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THE CHARTER OAK HEALTH CENTER AT CONNECTICUT CHILDREN'S MEDICAL CENTER WILL NOW BE RUN & OPERATED BY CONNECTICUT CHILDREN'S

HARTFORD, Conn. - Connecticut Children's Medical Center and Charter Oak Health Center jointly announce that their pediatric primary care center, Charter Oak Health Center at Connecticut Children's, will now be soley operated at Connecticut Children's by the Connecticut Children's Specialty Group. This transition will take place with no interruption of care to patients.

Patients and families will have the option to continue to use the medical care providers at Connecticut Children's or seek care at Charter Oak Health Center at 21 Grand Street. In addition, current patients will be given a list of providers from whom they can choose to receive primary care services going forward. Both parties will work together to make this transition as seamless as possible for patients and families.

"This change in operations will benefit many children and families in our community," said Martin J. Gavin, President and CEO of Connecticut Children's Medical Center. "In addition to better meeting the primary care needs of local children, we will now be able to offer greater access to our many health and wellness programs designed specifically for them."

David M. Semple, President and CEO of Charter Oak Health Center, added, "I know that we will continue to enjoy a great working relationship with Connecticut Children's so that we can provide the best healthcare to the children of this city."

Connecticut Children's has also announced that it will be <u>moving</u> its primary care services to a brand new, state-of-the-art location at **76** *New Britain Avenue in Hartford* beginning in April. Connecticut Children's is in the process of ensuring that all providers and patients are notified through various means of communication.

Connecticut Children's new primary care center will accommodate up to 36,000 patient visits per year, 12,000 more than its previous location. Expanded access to care will also be enhanced by the location's more central location and immediate proximity to bus lines. In addition, free on-site parking and on-site laboratory facilities will be available to make visiting Connecticut Children's easier for patients and families.
